ELLIS ISLAND — GATEWAY TO AMERICA



Ellis Island became the gateway to the United States for European immigrants in 1892. There immigrants were examined and either admitted to the United States or deported back to the countries from which they had come.

Between 1895 and 1924 twelve million immigrants came through Ellis Island, and at the height of its activity, the station processed one million people a year. It was used as an immigrant detention center until 1954, when it was closed. Now a part of the Statue of Liberty National Monument, its buildings are open for visits by the public.

This souvenir card honors the end of a decade of monumental effort that saw the United States five times break its earth bonds and explore the face of the moon.

Appropriate to the theme is the selection of the vignette pictured, that from the 1948 postage stamp commemorating the Centennial Anniversary of Fort Bliss. The research performed at Fort Bliss, the initial Army center for guided missile research and development, was important to the early knowledge of guided rocket flight and was a significant contribution toward the eventual placing of man upon the moon.

The background tint portrays the dramatic moment of lift-off of a space vehicle into flight.

These engravings, especially prepared for this souvenir card, are simulations of the basic designs of the first United States postage stamps, issued in 1847. The full frames shown are a present-day conception extending the detail obliterated by the profusion of lettering and numerals appearing on the original stamps. The issue comprised a 5¢ stamp bearing a portrait of Franklin and a 10¢ stamp with a portrait of Washington.

This is the third instance where the Bureau has prepared reproductions of the stamps. The first occasion was in 1875 in connection with a Post Office Department project offering for sale specimens of all postage stamps issued under its auspices up to that time. The second reproduction involved the engraving and printing of the Centenary of United States Postage Stamps Souvenir Sheet issued by that Department in 1947.

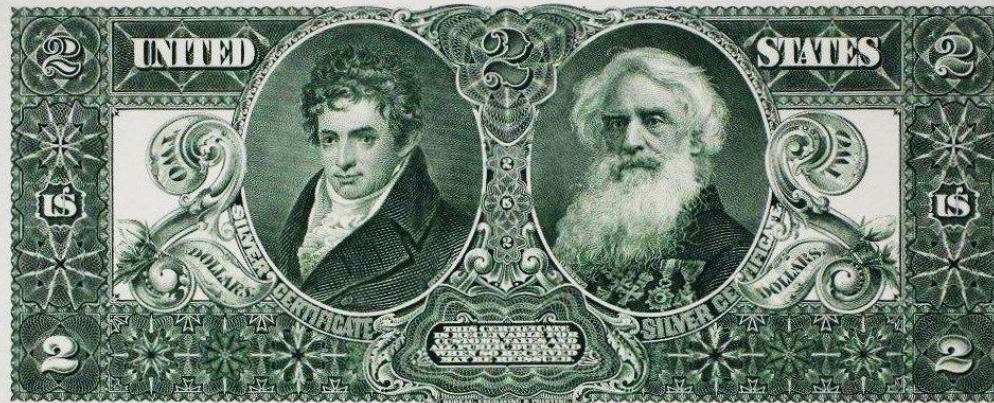

This engraving, printed from a plate prepared from the original master die, is a replica of the back of the 1896 \$2 Silver Certificate. It complements the face printing of this class, denomination, and series which was issued as a souvenir card in 1972. Design and execution of this back was by Thomas F. Morris, Chief of the Engraving Division of the Bureau at the time.

The allegorical design on the face of this note is titled, "Science Presenting Steam and Electricity to Commerce and Manufacture." Appropriately, the portraits of two inventors, Robert Fulton and Samuel Morse, are paired on this back to reflect their contributions to science in the fields of steam and electric power.
